Statement: I have been cautioned by Detective Inspector Barkell, that I am not obliged to say anything unless I wish, and understand that anything I do say will be taken down in writing and may be given in evidence. J. Collins.

I want to tell you the truth about certain stuff I have bought from other members of the Canadian Forces attached to Cricklewood garage. I know a private Matthew and knew that he was fairly frequently engaged in carrying property from the R.T.O. Euston Station and other stations in London. A sergeant Carter employed at the Cricklewood garage told me about 3 months ago that private Matthew had stuff to sell, and he told me that the bulk of the stuff he had was American clothing. I told Carter that if it was clothing I would like to buy a couple of shirts. A few days later Sergeant Carter told me he had some shirts for me from Matthew, and I bought three flannel shirts a wet belt and 1 necktie for which I paid him 30p. That was what he asked for them.
