CHAPTER 125.

Trade Unions Act.

Sections 2, 3, 32. Union workmen may, in absence of intimidation, take measures to prevent non-union workmen from obtaining employment in union shops: *Perrault v. Gauthier*, 28 Can. S. C. R. 241.
