cropping. We see no reason to be discouraged about the future, but would urge upon every dairyman the necessity of bringing every intelligent and practical development the experience of each year brings forth, to atd him in producing the best article of goods that the highest skill can bring forth, and there is no fear but that his labors will meet with a satisfactory reward. We have great faith in the benefit to be derived from a careful perusal of this report, and confidently hope it will be satisfactory to every member of this Association.
