Midland, its nearest railway point and bank  
location. Settled in 1868. It contains

public school, and ships lumber and timber.  
It has steamboat communication with Mid-  
land, Waubashene and Parry Sound during  
summer, and mails are carried from Parry  
Sound by Indians over government road  
and Georgian Bay, during winter. Popula-
