HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS.

on numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manfishs on at Turritories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been or reserved to p-wide wood lest for settless, or far may be homestcaded upon by or person who is the spially, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent on section, of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY.

Butry must be made personally at the local land effice for twich he which the land is situate.

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Deminion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:—

(I) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land each year during the term of three years.

(3) If the father (or mottier, if the father is deceased) of the home-stender resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person re-siding with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler was entitled to and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

the second homestead is in the vicinity of the next nomestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent readdence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land. The term 'vicinity' used above is meant to indicate the same town, township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2), (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

The privilege of a second entry is restricted by law to those settlors only who completed the duries upon their first homesteads to entitle them to patent on or before the 2nd June, 1889.

Every homesteader who falls to comply with the requirements of the homestead law is liable to ave his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

should be made at the end of three years, before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent, or the Homestead Inspector. Before making application for patent, the settler must give six months' notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands, at Ottawa, of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION.

Newly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Winnipeg or at any Dominion Lands Office in Manitola or the North-West Territories, information as to the lands that are open for entry, and from the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in securing land to quit them. Full information respecting the land, timber, coal and mineral laws, as well as respecting Dominion Lands in the Railway Belt in British folumble, may be obtained upon application to the Secretary of the Department of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, Manitoha, or to any of the Dominion Land Agenta in anitoba or the North-West Territories.
