FIVE MINUTE SERMONS FOR EARLY MASSES BY THE PAULIST FATHERS.

Preached in their Church of St. Paul the Apostle, Fifty-two Street and Ninth Avenue, New York.

SEPTAGESIMA SUNDAY. "The kingdom of heaven is like to a householder who went out early in the morning to hire laborers into his vineyard."
