* act in the same manner as if the same Rules and Regulations * were therein and thereby particularly established and enacted. AND WHEREAS great inconveniencies have been experienced from the annual Election of Persons to form such Rules and Regulations agreeable to the said provisions of the said herein before recited act: AND WHEREAS certain Rules and Regulations have been made and confirmed at a Special Sessions of the Peace held for the county of Northumberland on the twenty sixth, twenty seventh and twenty eighth days of January one thousand seven hundred and ninety sive agreeable to the provisions of the said herein before recited act; and it is expedient that the same should be continued without alterations for the term of three years.—

Regulations made in the month of January 1795, to semain in force until the 1th. of January 1799.

I. BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED, by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, That the Rules and Regulations which have been returned and submitted to the Justices of the Peace for the county of Northumberland at the said Special Sessions herein before mentioned, and by them approved of, confirmed, and established to be observed shall be and remain in full force until the first day of January which will be in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety nine and no longer, any thing in the said herein before recited act to the contrary notwithstanding.

Previo respecting rights of fishery claimed by the Heirs or Assigns of the late William Davidson. II. And be it further enacted, That the said herein before recited act and every clause, matter and thing therein contained, except wherein the same is hereby altered, shall be and remain in still force, any thing herein before contained to the contrary notwithstanding. PROVIDED, That nothing in this act contained shall extend or be construed to extend to authorize the General Sessions of the Peace for the county of Northumberland to establish a Net across the South West branch of the river Miramichi, or to do any act or thing which shall in any way affect, abridge, extend, ar alter the right of Fishery claimed at that place by the Heirs or Assigns, or Widow of the late William Davidson, Esquire, deceased or of any other person or persons whomsoever, any thing in the before recited act to the contrary notwithstanding.
