WHEREAS, on the fifth day of November now last past, We thought fit to prorogue Our Provincial Parliament to the twenty-fourth day of December instant, at which time, in Our City of Montreal, you were held and constrained to appear: Now know ye, that for divers causes and considerations, and taking into consideration the ease and convenience of Our loving subjects, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Executive Council, to relieve you, and each of you, of your attendance at the time aforesaid; hereby convoking, and by these presents enjoining you, and each of you, that on Tuesday, the second day of the month of February next, you meet Us, in Our Provincial Parliament, in Our City of *Montreal*, there to take into consideration the state and welfare of Our said Province of Canada, and therein to do as may seem necessary.—Herein fail not.
