OVER THE ANDES. A Railway to Connect Chillan and Argentine Capitals. WASHINGTON, May 4.-In a report to the state department Consul Mansfield, at Valparaiso, says that during the last session of the Chilean congress, which adjourned in February, a bill was passed which provided for the construction of a railway over the Andes mountains to connect Buenos Ayres with Santiago and Valparaiso. This will be the first line to cross the continent of South America.
