Great Loss of Life in Storms of Arkansas

Tornadoes Swept Through Ten Counties Late Yesterday—Fifty People at Least Are Killed and Over 200 Injured—Property Damage is Very Heavy.

By Special Wire to the Courier. Little Rock, Ark., June 6.—At least fifty persons are believed to be dead and 250 injured to-day as the result of a series of tornadoes that swept through ten or more counties in Arkansas late yesterday.

All means of communication were cut off or crippled, and early to-day details of the tragedy were far from complete. It was feared the list of dead and injured would be greatly increased with later reports.

The greatest destruction was reported at Judsonia, a town of about 800 inhabitants, about 50 miles north-east of Little Rock, on the Iron Mountain railroad. One third of the town was destroyed.

Three white persons and two negroes were killed in Dallas county, in the south, central part of the state. At Hot Springs four were killed and eight injured.

Only the extreme eastern and southern portions of the state appear to have escaped.

The property damage is believed to be very heavy.

BELGIANS MAKE GAINS IN GERMAN EAST AFRICA

Have Penetrated 125 Miles Into Enemy Territory.

By Special Wire to the Courier. Havre, June 6.—The Belgian forces operating in German East Africa have penetrated 125 miles into the enemy's territory, since the middle of April, according to an official statement issued to-day by the Belgian war office.

The Pope is now said to be determined not to intervene, lest he be suspected of favoring the central powers. Besides, it is expected that he will inform the allies that he will refuse mediation, especially on the part of President Wilson, whose efforts for peace are suspected here to be prompted by considerations concerning his re-election.
