SIFTON'S SPEECH.

Mr. Sifton's speech on the Yukon scandalr s a play to the galleries purely and simply. does not alter the conditions in the Yukon erritory one whit. Great stress was laid by the minister on the fact that considerable oney had been spent by the Yukon Council in aid of hospitals and for other charitable urposes. Mr. Sifton neglected, however, to cate that nearly all of that money was from local revenue and was in no wise consected with the returns paid into the Dominion treasury. In other words, it was some thing entirely unconnected with the government's attitude toward the Yukon, and should no more be credited to the generosity of the interior department than should money exded in the city of Ottawa by city authoriles for similar purposes. Mr. Sifton was in pard straits for argument, and was compelled o bank very strongly on the fact that most of is hearers knew very little about Dawson and the Yukon, in general. That he did not hesitate to take every advantage of this fact a perusal of his speech will clearly prove.

A MISTAKE.
