Site of the Garden of Eden

About 3,000 men are at work on the region between Babylon and Bagdad, which Sir William Willcocks thinks was the site of the Garden of Eden. At present it is an arid desert, but the Turkish Government seems determined to do for it what Anglo-Egypt has done for the lower Nile. Sir John Jackson is to perform feats

on the Euphrates by building barrages, so as to suffuse the arid regions with the fertilizing waters of the river. At first a district of 600,000 acres will be irrigated, at a cost of \$7,500,000 after which the value of the land now practically nil will be at least \$50,000,000. When entirely irrigated Sir William Willcocks estimates that this re-suscitated Garden of Eden will have acquired a value of \$190,000,000.—Young Churchman
