The regular monthly meeting of the Advisory Board of the Children's Aid Society, was held yesterday afternoon in the County Clerk's office Harrison Hall, at 4.30.

There were present Mesdames Stephenson, J. L. Beay, Fells, Tuffs, H. D. Smith, Williams, Goodland and Newbury, and Messrs. Somerville, Patterson, Reeve, Austin, and Dr. R. V. Bray.

The executive officer, Dr. R. V. Bray, reported since May 12 visits made 7, letters written 20, interviews 9, cases reported for investigation 2, investigated 1, still under observation 1, children made wards of the society 1, children placed in homes 1, applications for children 2.

After some explanation the report was adopted.

Accounts to the amount of \$21.23 were ordered paid.

Messrs. Bray and Patterson were

appointed to act with the St. Vincent de Paul Society in reference to a couple of cases.

The executive officer reported two cases in the country needing attention. These will be attended to as soon as possible.

The King's Daughters were invited to join with the Children's Aid Society in holding a rummage sale early in the fall.

Donations of \$10 from the Blenheim town council and \$5 from Mrs. Newbury, were thankfully acknowledged, also donations of shoes from Geo. W. Cowan, and clothing from Mrs. Goodland.
