"Arrived at Samin at 4., m., went on board the steamer Wisconsin, which left for Duluth at 9.30 the same svening. The Wisconsin is a fine, large, jamerican propagate, we had a splendid run, which I allow the had a splendid run, which I allow the water, mostly as amooth as glass both of Lakes Huron and Superior. It was warm snough to remain on deek without an overcost most of the time. The distance from Sarnia to Duluth is 644 miles. We sarviced at Duluth at present, it being too early; there were only 3 cabin passengers besides myself, so that we had lots of the typ best quality; I had speckled trout for investigation. They gave us plenty to eat of the twey best quality; I had speckled trout for investigation and it was precedy delicious. It is much more pleasant travelling by, boat than by railroad. Duluth is a mart city; they have the finest docks I ever saw except at New York and Montreal, it being the head of inland navigation and is destined to become a very large city. It is situated on a hill, the streets rising gradually one above asother; it looks fine from the lake; the holidings are mostly wood however and do not look as substantial as those of eastern dities. There are a few very fine brick holoks. We left Duluth at 4.10 p. m. by the Northern Pacific Railroad for Brainard, 114 miles west. I had no conception that there was anywhere such a large treat of worthless land in the temperate zone, (except on the Sahara or Great Desert of Africa) as I saw there a tamarind swamp with treessmall and juearly dead—a juest wilderness that will never be made to become as the rose, by human agency at all events. From Brainard to Fargo. 138 miles, we passed through in the night and I could not see what it was like. I got to Fargo on Sunday morning at 3.30 o'clock. It is a rising city of ten thousand inhabitants on the prairie, grand land but a little too heavy in this section of the country, the streets were very muddy. I think it would make good mucilage, it sticks well snaybow. I had to remain at the take more th

tance from a railway elevator. Mr. Hagaman asks \$30 per acre for part of his farm, but I understand would take less. Building material is very scarce, they have no stones of any consequence and lumber is very dear, very common from \$19 to \$20 per M. Hired help is high, girls getting from \$16 to \$20 per month and men are getting \$18 per month now and during harvest, and threshing \$2 per day, after harvest \$26 per month till frost day, after harvest \$26 per month till frost sets in. There are no trees but what have been planted and they co not thrive very well; box elder does the best; they have a fine clump on this farm about 20 feet high, sovering a couple of acres; they haveled to keep the ground cultivated in order to grow them, they look something like Canadian poplars."
