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MILWAUKEE, Oct. 17.—The wind storm which prevailed here yesterday and last night was the severest ever known in this section, and the barometer was never known to be so low. The wind from the south-southwest was blowing at the rate of twenty miles an hour. A large fleet of vessels sought this harbor for safety and now lie at the gate in the bay.

The storm all along the Southern Minnesota Railway is the severest known in years. Passenger and freight trains along the line were blocked in snow drifts from ten to twelve feet deep, and teams with provisions have been dispatched to their relief from several points. The train which left La Crosse on Friday has not been heard of since leaving Felda that the road is still raging.

There was considerable property destroyed by a fire at Charleston, S. C., on Saturday last.

London, Oct. 15.—All four prisoners in custody on suspicion of being concerned in the murder of Lord Mountbatten, the only witness examined at the inquest yesterday, were unable to identify any of them as the persons who met on the road at the time the murder was committed.

Troy, N. Y., Oct. 15.—At a Republican meeting at Johnstown, last night, Charles Nutting, Melville Welling, Charles Thomas, John Fay and a Frenchman were injured by the explosion of a cannon. Nutting's leg was shattered. Welling's left arm was torn to pieces and was amputated; he will die. Thomas, aged eighty, had his left leg, knee, elbow and wrist broken; he will die. The others are slightly injured.

New York, Oct. 14.—Martin Lynch, who lost all his savings in betting on the Indiana election, out of his throat yesterday and died. The house of Geo. Riley was burned at Bradford, Pa., today, and three children burned in it.
