PUBLIC HEALTH NURSES READY

The public health nurses when they go out to their fields in the province will have as complete and perfect an equipment as can be obtained. The five nurses who were trained at the Victorian Order training school and who were graduated recently are to go to their respective districts on July 1. The Red Cross Social, which assumed their training, is now assuming responsibility for their equipment. The committee which was especially appointed to arrange for the securing of the kit and equipment in consultation with Miss Coates, the superintendent of the V. O. N., has made a list of all the articles required and is now at work seeing that every item on the list be available for each of the five nurses as she enters on her work. Not only is the kit to be sufficient to meet all the requirements of the nurse at the outset in medical, surgical and emergency supplies, but it is to form a model for all future needs. The local Red Cross branches have been asked to help the nurses in their districts and it is thought that the initial supplies given the nurses will be patterns to guide the members of the local societies in making more as they are required. The equipment is not only for the actual needs of nursing but for the public health work done for the safeguarding of health and that the nurses undertake in outposts. In their campaign to prevent disease the work of making up the equipment is being carried on at the Red Cross depot and it is found to be no light and easy task.
