INSANITY IN ONTARIO. Why Ontario People Go Crazy, and How They Are Cared For. On September 30, 1882, Dr. W. T. O'Reilly reported that there were within the province 2,933 persons of unsound mind officially known to the department.

It is interesting to know that of the patients admitted to different asylums during 1883, 282 were married and 316 unmarried. As regards nationality, the United States furnished the smallest contingent, namely, 16, while Canada stands highest, with 391.

Dr. O'Reilly's statement of the assigned causes of insanity has a peculiar interest, not only for those of morbid mind, but for all who make human nature and the human intellect objects of special study. It would seem, according to his statement, that out of a total of 464 cases, 190 were assigned to causes unknown.

In 1877, 437 lunatics were admitted to the provincial asylums, as compared with 519 in 1883. The five asylums cost in 1883, \$377,095.10. During last year the cost of each patient was \$132.30 in Toronto, and \$145.12 in Kingston.
