WAS OVERHAULED BY A BRITISH WARSHIP.

The Norwegian steamer Grena, Capt. Dieson, entered port at 6 o'clock this morning. She is in for orders and came from Bergen, Norway, in ballast. The run was made in eight and a half days. Originally the ship left Bergen for Antwerp with a load of freight, but owing to the state of war at the latter place the Grena had to retreat to Bergen to discharge, and she then left for this side of the water. A striking example of the activity and vigilance in which the seas are being protected by Great Britain is the fact that while off the north coast of Scotland the Grena was hailed by large British warship and ordered to which order was adhered to by as volunteers, viz., Arthur Heath, of Capt. 
