Harding Receives Republican Nomination

Presidential Dark Horse Brought in at the Last Moment -- Head of Albanian Delegation Assassinated in Paris--Trail Yacht Vanitie Wins Third Victory Over Resolute -- Anglo-Japanese Agreement to be Continued.

SENATOR HARDING NOMINATED.

CHICAGO, June 13. Warren Harding, United States Senator from Ohio, was nominated for President last night by the Republican National Convention, after a deadlock which lasted for nine ballots and which finally forced out of the running all the original favorites. His running mate the convention named Governor Calvin Coltrige of Massachusetts, upsetting the plan of the combination of Harding backers to nominate for a place Senator Lenfest of Wisconsin. The collapse of the forces of Governor Frank Lowden and their transfer in a large part to Senator Harding put the Ohio candidate over Harding received a franchise over 520 votes.

ANGLO-JAPANESE AGREEMENT.

WASHINGTON, June 13. In order that the Dominions of Canada and Australia may exercise the right to express their views at the Imperial Conference to be held, probably in London, next fall, a decision has been reached by the British Government to continue the existing treaty between Great Britain and Japan. The understanding reached between the two nations is believed here to be based upon an abandonment of any effort at present, to change the conditions of the existing treaty. This treaty, it is said, will continue in force indefinitely subject, however, that either Government may after July thirteen give notice of its intention to ask for amendments or

total abrogation within one year thereafter.

PASHA ASSASSINATED.

PARIS, June 13. Esad Pasha, head of the Albanian Delegation in Paris and former President of Albania, was assassinated here to-day. Three shots were fired at him by an Albanian student, two of which took effect. Esad was emerging from the Hotel Continental in the Rue Castillon when he was suddenly confronted by a young man, who later gave his name as Rustem Aveni, and said he was an Albanian student. Without uttering a word Aveni fired two shots which struck Esad Pasha in the chest and another shot which went wild. Esad sank to the ground. He was picked up and taken to his bedroom where he shortly afterwards died. The assassin was arrested by a waiter. He told the police he arrived in Paris on May 1st and declared the crime was not premeditated. Recognizing Esad Pasha on the street, whom he held to be responsible for the sufferings of Albania, he said he felt a sudden impulse and fired the shots.

SUGAR CARGO DESTROYED.

NEW YORK, June 13. Part of a cargo of sugar valued at a million and a half, was destroyed here yesterday, when fire broke out in the second hold of the French line steamer Cardigan. The ship was loading for Havre.

VANITIE SCORES AGAIN.

NEWPORT, R.I., July 13. The Vanitie scored her third victory in the seventh race with the Resolute, for the America's Cup defense honors on Saturday. The Gardner boat's margin was four minutes and eight seconds in addition to the allowance which she gave. The course was a triangular one, of two reaches and one beat.

POLES DRIVEN BACK.

LONDON, June 13. Polish lines, both north and south of Kiev, on the west bank of the Dnieper are being driven in by the Bolsheviks, who are cutting Polish railway communications with the city, according to Friday's official communication from Moscow.

A BRUTAL DUEL.

NEW YORK, June 13. Omfredo Carracolo, a barber, armed with revolver, and Louis Viscoho, longshoreman, with a knife, fought an uneven duel in a lonely spot in Seventeenth Street last night until Viscoho had been killed. The barber, covered with blood and badly slashed about the arms and legs, was captured by the police, as he was running from the scene. Carracolo, the police say, said that the men's quarrel was about the longshoremen's strike, and it was agreed that each should retire to his room and return with whatever weapons he possessed and fight it out.

PRIZE RING.

LONDON, June 13. Joe Beckett, champion heavyweight of England, and Tommy Burns, ex-champion of the world, have signed articles for a twenty-round contest at the Albert Hall on July 15th.

ATTEMPTED ASSASSINATION.

CAIRO, June 13. An unsuccessful attempt was made this morning to assassinate the Egyptian Premier by means of bomb.

A HARDING BOOM.

CHICAGO, June 13. Harding of Ohio, emerged to-day from the all night conference of Republican Chieftains as the man expected to break the imminent deadlock on the presidential nomination. On him they plan to concentrate their strength should the convention fail to break through the blockade established yesterday by four ballots. Senator Harding participated in the conference and also saw Senator Johnson in the latter's private apartments, but the Californian Senator described the visit as a "convention call." Details of the meeting were not disclosed. It gained significance because the backers of the Harding movement are looking to Johnson supporters for aid if their plans materialize.

THE CARRANZA MURDER.

MEXICO CITY, June 13. Generals Murguia, Urquiza, Montes and Barragan have been formally detained in connection with the death of former President Carranza. This action was taken by the Third Federal District Court last night.

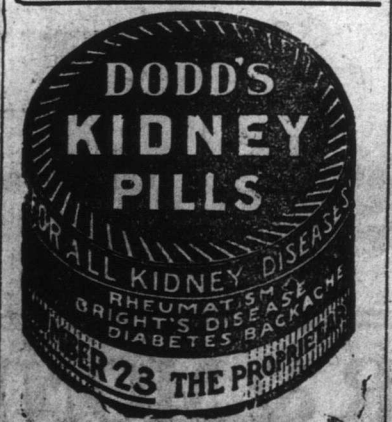
