Electric Light Speeds up Grass Growth

ON GOLF COURSE.
To perfect the turf on the greens in one fourth of the usual time, electric lights were used to grow grass at the new million dollar Bradley Beach Golf Club, Bradley Beach, N.J., U.S.A. Twenty-four reflectors, each containing a one-thousand watt lamp, were installed over the practice green by the Westinghouse Lamp Company. The green was seeded by Peter Henderson & Company with "creeping bent," the best but most difficult golf grass to grow in the United States because of its slow growth and the comparatively short growing season. Two months after the seed was planted, the green was ready for use, thus saving six or seven months of the ordinary growing time required, and securing a more perfect turf than could otherwise be obtained.

The reflectors on the golf green were suspended from cables at a height of about four feet from the ground, and about seven feet apart, furnishing an even light over the whole area so that the grass would grow evenly. The grass seed under the lights came up in five days, while on the rest of the course it took two days longer. At the end of six weeks the grass under the lights had reached a growth of four inches, while that outside the lights was only one inch high. It was also found that the grass under the lights was much thicker, and there were not nearly so many weeds on the green, probably because the grass was sturdier and heavier.

In forcing the growth of the grass by artificial light, the illumination was kept on for five hours every night, allowing the rest of the night for rest, as plants must rest just as human beings do. All plants, including grass, assimilate and digest from the air and earth only under the stimulation of light, so that by giving them several hours more "daylight" they are enabled to obtain more nourishment and therefore grow much faster.

These facts were proved conclusively in a recent series of experiments by the Westinghouse Lamp Company in which it was found that by the use of artificial light, greenhouse growers can bring their holiday flowers to bloom the very day on which they want them for market. By depending on nature alone, growers have in many cases lost their entire earnings because a few cloudy days resulted in blossoms after and not before the holiday.

The same system was applied to the golf grass at the Bradley Beach Golf Club. As every golfer knows, the turf on putting greens represents a large investment in seed, time and labor. The best grasses are hard to grow and a period of one year is generally required before a newly established green is ready for play. Meanwhile the green produces no playing revenues and requires a great deal of care in order to produce a satisfactory turf.

It is estimated that about four hundred new golf clubs open yearly in the United States, and the saving that can be made by applying this use of electric light is tremendous.

Zinovieff Letter Writer and Murderer

In spite of denials there is no reason to doubt the authenticity of the now celebrated Gregory Zinovieff note which played such a prominent part in the recent British election and was largely responsible for the downfall of the MacDonald Government. When one remembers that this same Zinovieff as far back as last spring in addressing the Red Army gave way to his feelings to the extent of expressing hatred for British and everything British it would be surprising indeed if he were not the author of the note. Everything in his career points to his being the sworn enemy of the British Empire and he would no doubt be happy if he could see it overthrown and his own cut throats in charge.

The president of the executive committee of the Soviet Third International, to give Zinovieff his full title, is described by those who know him as an obese, ragged-haired fellow with bloodshot eyes and a sort of concentrated hastiness about him. He is the chief of the seven people who today constitute the ruling power in Russia. The Big Seven, as they are called, the others being Trotsky, chief of the Red Army, Bukharin, editor of the "Pravda"; Tomski, the labor boss; Kamaney, chief of the Moscow Soviet; Statin, secretary of the party; and Rykof, the woman premier.

This bureau is the brain and directing force of Bolshevism, both in and out of Russia, and unquestionably Zinovieff is the arch fiend of the outfit. Born in 1883, Zinovieff, or you may spell it Zinovief if you like, is the son of a Jewish trader of Novomirgorod. He first visited England in 1907 as a delegate to the conference of the Russian Social Democratic party, and in this manner became acquainted with the "cream of the British Socialists," with whom by the way he has been flirting ever since. Among his English friends of latter years are numbered George Lansbury and Robert Williams, both of whom were specially honored by the Russian chief. Zinovieff has another special friend in Tom Mann. So it will be seen that he is able to keep pretty well informed as to communist conditions in Great Britain.

In 1909 Zinovieff was a member of the editorial department of the "Social Democrat," and a little later on he lived with Lenin at Cracow. When the war broke out he went to Switzerland where Lenin joined him. In 1915 Zinovieff together with Lenin began his campaign against the Allies, and in speeches and articles attributed to the cause of the war to British Imperialism. By means of smuggled correspondence he got in touch with the British pacifists, among them Ramsay MacDonald and Morel, who, by the way, died the other day.

In March, 1917, Zinovieff returned to Russia through German territory with the help of the German General Staff secret service department. In Russia he became active in the campaign to demoralize the Russian army. How well he and his friends succeeded, all men know. The mounds and graveyards of the Allied lines give silent testimony as to the success of their movement.

When the Bolshevik leaders left for Moscow Zinovieff remained behind in Petrograd, there to become the head of the Petrograd Commune. As the head of the Commune he signed the death warrant of thousands of innocent people, and was personally present at the execution of many hundreds. He was also the originator of the "Cheka," the Commune's prize murder squad.

In the course of a speech delivered at the first meeting of a Bolshevik conference at Petrograd in 1918, Zinovieff is reported to have said, according to the London "Observer": "We must win over to our side ninety millions of the hundred millions of the inhabitants of Russia under the Soviets. As for the rest, we have nothing to say for them—they must be annihilated."

At another meeting a week later Zinovieff moved the following resolution: "This meeting welcomes the fact that wholesale terror is being adopted, and declares that the proletariat will shoot not only hundreds but thousands." And the bloody minded scoundrel has kept his word.

From 1918 to the present Zinovieff has devoted a great deal of his time and much of his energy to plots against the British Empire. He organized a "school" for propagandists at Moscow and sent his pupils to the East to undermine British influence. It was during this period that he renewed his English associations by entertaining British born visitors, among them those that are mentioned above.

Zinovieff and his whole precious outfit are the sworn enemies of all law, order and morality. They are out to overturn civilization. He believes in murder and civil war. And there he has not succeeded either in the British Isles or on this continent is our singular good fortune.

Such is the man who plotted to paralyze the British army and navy and endeavored to have the men turn their guns on their officers as was done in Russian at an earlier date.—Saturday Night.

Toronto Scare is Joker's Work

Ku Klux Klan Blazing Emblems
Merely Result of Pranks.

Toronto, Nov. 24.—The Ku Klux Klan scare which flared up in Toronto last night seems about to be disposed of through the exposure of practical jokes. Of the two fiery crosses which were set off in different parts of the city almost simultaneously, one at least has been found to be a schoolboy trick. The other has not been explained.

Nine students at Trinity College are said to have been responsible for the flaming cross seen in the college grounds last night. The boys are said to have been staging a show for the diversion of girls in a neighboring college, and they wore the traditional white shroud and hood for the occasion.

About the same time, however, another fiery cross blazed out of the darkness some distance away. Oil-soaked planks, nine feet by seven, formed this cross, which had been embedded in oil-soaked rags and set on fire at the end of Merton Street Bridge. When the fire department had extinguished the flames, some woodwork on the bridge had already started to burn.

There is no vestige of clue to the identity of the perpetrators of this second joke, which, because of the danger of the fire spreading, was more serious than the first. The first will be dealt with by college authorities. The police are investigating the second.
