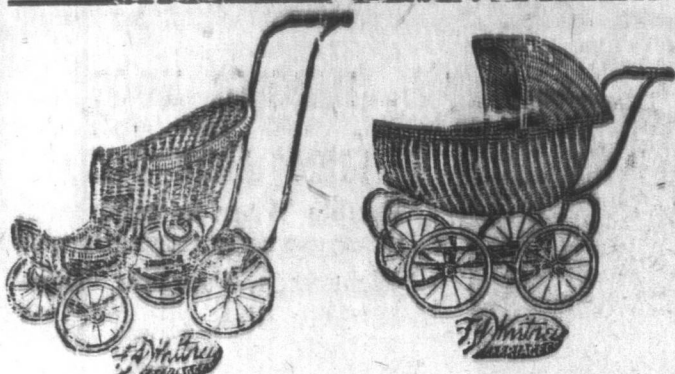

Crust of Bread Found to be Less Nourishing

Making children eat bread crusts may be a useful practice from an economical standpoint, but the time-honored belief that the crusts possess better dietary qualities than the center of the bread seems to have scant basis in fact. This was revealed in some interesting experiments just completed by Professor Roscoe Hart Shaw of the American Institute of Baking.

Professor Shaw took two young albino rats of the same breed and fed one on crusts and the other on crumbs from the centers of the same loaves. The rat that was fed on

crumbs reached normal size at maturity and was strong and active, while the other remained scarcely larger than a mouse and was weak and puny. Repetition of the experiment on other rats brought always the same result.
