> London, Sept. 16. (C.P.)-The Daily Mail draws attention to the decrease in British emigration which. declares, is being strangled by doles and pensions. The paper states that the greatest demand for emigration to-day is coming not from the hundreds of thousands of young lads and young men who are content to be workless while drawing the dole, but from the older men with families who are not yet demoralized.

Despite the increasing unemployment in Britain the total number of emigrants to the Dominions this year is less than last year. For the months of April, May and June last the returns show that 11,640 persons emigrated to the Dominions as compared with 12,449 for the same period last year. There has been an actual slump in the emigration to Australia, but this is partly due to the immediate effect of the signing of the new agreement between the Governments of Britain and the Commonwealth which will require another year before it is in full opera-
