One Hundred and Sixteen to Take a Vote in January.

Toronto, Nov. 23.-Local option will be voted on in 116 different constituencies at the time of the municipal elections on Jan. 1. A great many of these places are in Western Ontario, especially the villages and townships.

Only two cities are on the list, Brantford and Peterboro. The greater number are townships, where those who are leaders in the movement think there is a much better chance of passing the bylaw. The vote will be taken in the following places on Jan. 1:
