It will therefore be one of the objects of this journal, to urge upon the people of the Lower Provinces, a return to English ideas, and a modification to some degree, of the system of Universal Suffrage. Experience has proved the fact that while Property should not, of itself be the controlling power in the state, or be suffered to assume a dictatorial position in the government, it ought to be allowed to exert its due influence. Citizens who are bound to their country by the ties of interest, who, in brief, are something to lose, are apt to prove the wisest patriots and the safest politicians.

Particular attention will be paid, and a department of the Periodical devoted to the subject of popular Education. All the great Intercolonial questions—such as the Union of the Provinces under one Government, the development of their Agricultural, Mining, and Manufacturing resources, &c. &c. will receive due notice.
