CIRCUIT COUR. Sherbrooke, 12th May, 1874.

MURRAY *vs.* THE GRAND TRUNK RAILWAY CO.

HELD : That under defendant's bill of lading a lien upon the goods carried was created as well for demurrage as for freight.

This case was a *saisie-revendication* of eighty bushels of oats, forty-seven linen bags, one butter tub and one grain shovel, the whole of \$53.70 under the following circumstances :

On the 21st January, 1874, the oats were shipped from St. Hyacinthe to Sherbrooke, under a bill of lading of defendant which contained these conditions : No. 13. "Demurrage charged on all cars not unloaded within 24 hours after its arrival." No. 17. "The charges on all freight, etc.....must be paid before the goods will be delivered." No. 9. "That all goods from whomsoever received or to whomsoever belonging shall be subject to a general lien not only for the carriage of these particular goods, but also for any general balance that may be due by the owners
