The eleven remaining cases of continued fevers in the Hospital at the end of the last month, seem to have been rather variyng towards a Typhoid Type; and the 33 cases admitted during the present month, were decidedly that Typhus characterised, by authors by the name Milior.

Michael Hays died of Pulmonic affection, he had been a convalescent of the fever and sent under a tent, in order to avoid the danger of a relapse, and in one of these extraordinary cold

and wet nights of the month he caught a fatal cold.

Michal AlcDonaught was almost dying when admitted, and so was John Handly. General bleeding and thoroughly clearing, the prime vie were the usual preliminary course of treatment. Tartar emetic and calonel, (1 of a grain of the former with two or three grains of the latter every 3 hours) have been chiefly employed for the cure; limonade, plenty of diluting drink, cleanne-s and ventilation generally completed it.
