The Third French Army Corps, with headquarters at Rouen, will soon be engaged in a series of manoeuvres of special interest to military experts. The principal operations began on Sept. 6th with a series of sham fights between the two divisions composing the corps. Later on the bulk of the Army corps will manoeuvre against an enemy represented by an Infantry brigade and three batteries of Artillery; but the coup of the proceedings was the "forcing" of the passage of the Epte stream on the 10th, under the fire of a greater number of guns than has been brought together at any of the previous manoeuvres." On the following day there was a battle between Guzay and Farceaux, the programme winding up with a big review on the 14th.

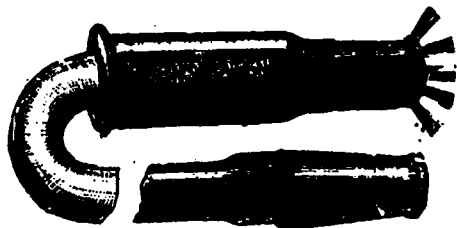

The deposit receipts thus sent in will be returned to the respective parties whose tenders are not accepted.
