According to the conditions under which Provincial Secretary McLellan awarded his cup five years ago, it was to be competed for at five consecutive meetings of the association. The winners, Lieut. J. D. Perkins, Lieut. J. F. McMillan, Capt. W. Langstroth, Sergt. W. H. Adams, Lieut. and S. Langstroth, were to shoot off for the ownership. Range, 600 yards, seven shots at this meeting. The absence of Lieut. McMillan left but four men to face the targets. Lieut. Perkins will take it home, having scored 27; Sergt. Adams 25; Capt. Langstroth 23 and Lieut. Langstroth 19.

On Wednesday evening Pte. Langstroth and Lieut. McFarlane tied in the Prince of Wales match for the cup. In the shoot off, three rounds, Langstroth realized 14 and McFarlane 13, so the former takes the cup, medal and \$10; the latter gets \$12 second money.

Westmorland had sufficient force take a hand in this match making four teams. The conditions were:—

The challenge cup presented by the Honorable the late Wm. Elder, and \$88 added by the P. R. A. Open to teams of eight members from each county association affiliating with the P. R. A. Those only eligible to shoot on a team who shall have been resident in the county which they represent for at least six months prior to the date of the match. The names of the members comprising each team to be given to the secretary before the commencement of the competition. The cup to be held during the year by the highest scorer in the winning team, and to be returned to the secretary of the P. R. A. before the next annual matches. Entrance fee, per team, \$4; ranges, 200, 500 and 600 yards; number of shots, seven at each distance; position, standing or kneeling at 200, any, with head to target, at remaining distances.
