

Ottawa civil servants, especially those in the Department of Customs, are greatly pleased at the conferring of the Distinguished Service Order upon Acting Lieutenant-Colonel Herbert Victor Rorke, assistant accountant of that department. Lieut.-Col. Rorke, who holds his militia commission in the 31st "Grey" regiment, went overseas with the Second Division of the Canadian Expeditionary Force, and has had a lot of hard service at the front.
