Annex "A"

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA PROJECTS APPROVED UNDER SUBSIDIARY ARRANGEMENTS

- I. Unless otherwise indicated in subsidiary arrangements, the Government of Canada shall finance the following expenditures, on the basis of the rates authorized in compliance with its regulations.
- (A) Expenditures related to Haïtian scholarship holders:
 - 1. registration and tuition fees, books, supplies or material required;
 - 2. a living allowance;
 - 3. medical and hospital expenses;
 - 4. economy-class fares for travel by air or any other approved means of transportation, in compliance with the requirements of the scholarship program.
- (B) Expenditures related to Canadian personnel:
 - 1. the salaries, fees and other remuneration provided for in the contracts;
 - 2. the various benefits and allowances provided for in the contracts, insofar as they are not the responsibility of the Government of Haïti.
- (C) Expenditures related to certain projects:
 - 1. the cost of engineering, architectural and other services required for project execution;
 - 2. the cost of providing merchandise, materials, supplies, equipment and other goods and transporting same to the port of entry in Haïti.
- II. Contracts for the purchase of goods or the provision of services financed by the Government of Canada shall be signed by the Government of Canada or one of its agencies. However, arrangements may be made for the Government of Haïti to sign such contracts itself in compliance with conditions specified in subsidiary arrangements. Where such conditions are not specified, the following conditions shall apply:
- 1. goods and services acquired n Canada shall have a Canadian content of not less than sixty-six and two-thirds per cent (66 2/3%);
- 2. there shall be an invitation to tender and the contract shall be awarded to the lowest bidder;
- 3. the terms and conditions of payment and other contract clauses shall be approved in advance by the Government of Canada;
- 4. Canadian suppliers shall be paid directly by the Government of Canada.
