

MR. MARVIN GELBER

Mr. Marvin Gelber was born on November 1, 1912, in Toronto, and was educated at Upper Canada College and the University of Toronto, from which he received a B.A. in economics and political science.

He served with the Canadian Army during World War II, and was released with the rank of lieutenant. Mr. Gelber, who is an executive in Toronto with a continuing interest in international affairs, has also been National President of the United Nations Association in Canada, Chairman of the Executive Board of the National UNICEF Committee, and is a member of the National Executive of the Canadian Institute of International Affairs. He is one of the Directors of the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, and a member of the Board of Directors of the Art Gallery of Ontario.

Mr. Gelber was elected to the House of Commons for the riding of York-South in 1963, and was a Member of Parliament until 1965. Mr. Gelber was Canada's representative on the Economic Committee of the Economic and Social Council in 1965, attending both the 38th session in New York and the 39th session in Geneva that year.
