PRAYERS.

The Clerk of the House laid upon the Table the Eighth Report of the Clerk of Petitions, stating that he had examined the Petition presented on the 9th instant, and finds that all the requirements of Standing Order 68 have been complied with in this case. The said Petition was then read and received, and is as follows:—

Of Aziz Koudsy (otherwise known as Eddie Coudsy), of Montreal, Quebec; praying for the passing of an Act to declare his marriage with Marie Shahda Koudsy, of Montreal, Quebec, to be dissolved, and that he be divorced from her.—*Mr. Gray.*

Mr. Speaker informed the House,—That the Clerk had laid on the Table the Fourth Report of the Examiner of Petitions for Private Bills, which was read as follows:—

Pursuant to Standing Order 99, Section 2, the Examiner of Petitions for Private Bills has the honour to present the following as his Fourth Report:—

Your Examiner has duly examined the following Petitions for Private Bills, and finds that all the requirements of the 95th Standing Order have been complied with in each case, viz:—

Of Prudential Trust Company Limited; to reduce the authorized capital of the Company.

Of Duplate Safety Glass Company of Canada, Limited; to empower the Commissioner of Patents to issue patents for certain inventions, notwithstanding anything in the Patent Act contained.

The Clerk of the House laid on the Table the following Private Bills:—

Bill No. 11, An Act respecting Prudential Trust Company Limited.—*Mr. Bell (St. Antoine).*

Bill No. 12, An Act respecting patents on certain inventions of which Duplate Safety Glass Company of Canada, Limited, is entitled to the benefit.—*Mr. Lawson.*

The said Bills were read the first time and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House, pursuant to Standing Order 102.
