

Mr. Bradley, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of May 7, 1952, for a Return showing:—1. How many employees were working for the Foreign Exchange Control Board as at June 30, 1951?

2. On what date was the board discontinued?

3. How many employees were dismissed when the board discontinued operations?

4. How many were absorbed into other departments, and of these, what are their names, salaries, and present occupations?

Mr. Garson, a Member of the Queen's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copy of Appendices to a Report, dated March 8, 1952, to the Minister of Justice by the Committee (MacQuarrie Committee) appointed to study Combines Legislation, which was laid before the House Wednesday, April 9, 1952. The following Questions on the Order Paper were passed by the House as Orders for Return, under subsection 4 of Standing Order 44, and Orders of the House were issued to the proper officers accordingly:—

By Mr. Knowles:—What are the names and ages of all judges in Canada appointed by the Federal Government to the Supreme Court of Canada, the Exchequer Court of Canada, and the Superior Courts in each of the provinces?

By Mr. Gillis:—1. What was the total amount of coal produced in the Maritime Provinces bought by the Canadian National Railway in the year 1951, from (a) Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation; (b) other coal operators?

2. What was the total amount of subventions paid to the Canadian National Railways for carrying Maritime coal to various subvention areas for the year 1951?

By Mr. Robichaud:—Order of the House for a copy of all correspondence, telegrams, reports, petitions and surveys, from 1949 to date, relating to the construction of a federal building to house the Post Office and the Customs Office in the Village of Caraquet, County of Gloucester, New Brunswick.

By Mr. Robichaud:—Order of the House for a copy of all correspondence, telegrams, reports, and surveys, from 1949 to date, relating to the opening of a central Post Office in the Village of Petit Rocher, in the County of Gloucester, New Brunswick.

By Mr. Robichaud:—Order of the House for a copy of all correspondence, telegrams, reports, petitions and surveys, from 1949 to date, relating to the dredging of the harbour at Tracadie, in the County of Gloucester, New Brunswick, and the construction of adequate breakwaters for the protection of said harbour.
