whether partially municipal or not, and to include any  
any area partly surrounded by the area expressly de-  
scribed which appears to have been intended to be included.

In any doubtful case the Local Government shall finally  
determine of what electoral district it may any area be  
expressly referred to was intended to form part, and shall  
within the first three days after the session of Parliament  
next following any such determination report the same

with the reasons therefor to the Speaker of the House of  
Commons.

3. Wherever in the said schedule any word or expression  
is used to denote the name of any territorial division  
such word or expression shall, unless the context otherwise  
requires, be construed as indicating such territorial division  
as it exists and is denoted at the date of the passing of  
this Act.

4. Wherever in the said schedule a municipality or  
place is wrongly referred to as a city, or a town, or  
a village, but there is within the territorial limits of the  
electoral district in the description of which the reference  
occurs a municipality or place of the same name which  
is a city, or a town, or a village, but is not of the class—  
city, town or village, as the case may be—specified in the  
schedule, the reference shall be taken to be to that munici-  
pality or place.

5. This Act shall take effect only upon the dissolution  
of the present Parliament.

6. The Local Government may, if it thinks fit, make  
such regulations as may be necessary for giving effect to  
the provisions of this Act.
