Question No. 1,198-Mr. Cossitt:

With reference to the answer to Question No. 446 to the effect that travelling expenses for Mr. Michael Pitfield paid from public funds between April 20, 1968 and March 1, 1973 totalled \$14,75.14 and between March 1, 1973 and October 24, 1974 totalled \$6,037.14 (a) what is a complete list of all items along with costs that make up these totals (b) where did Mr. Pitfield travel in each case (c) what other government persons, if any, accompanied him in each case?

FISHERY PATROL-HMCS "ANNAPOLIS"

Question No. 1,265-Mr. Forrestall:

1. What has been the total cost to date for the operation of HMCS Annapolis in fisheries patrol work to assist the Department of the Environment (Fisheries)?

2. What has been the operating cost per day for the *Annapolis* while engaged in such support for the Department?

3. To what specific vote has the operating costs of the HMCS *Annapolis* been charged in respect of those costs incurred in fisheries patrol work for the Department?

4. Has the cost of effecting fisheries patrol by the *Annapolis* for the Department been charged to its budget and, if not, for what reason?

5. To which departmental budget are fisheries patrol work carried out for the Department by the Department of National Defence or other departments charged as a matter of specific government policy?

Hon. James Richardson (Minister of National Defence): 1 and 2. The cost to operate HMCS Annapolis is approximately \$3,937 per day exclusive of personnel costs. HMCS Annapolis has been used for 13 days to carry out fisheries patrol work in conjunction with military surveil lance duties.

3. Vote 1—Defence Services Program.

4. No. Funds are provided by parliament in Vote 1 of the Defence Services Program for the Protection of Canada which includes fishery patrols by military vessels.

5. The costs of fisheries patrols carried out by military vessels are charged to the budget of the Department of National Defence.
