Dear Captain Erskine:-

On the afternoon of the 6th of October next we are having the formal opening of our new Pathological Institute and in the evening the Founder's Day ceremonies and Convocation.

The new Pathological Institute, to which you will find reference made in the Annual Report of this University, will be the equal of any on this continent and the event of its opening will be the most important university occasion since the centennial celebration. The University would be much honoured and it would be the source of the greatest possible gratification to myself if His Excellency, as Visitor of the University, could make it convenient to be present on that occasion. We should like him, if he would do so, to declare the building open.

This opening ceremony will be followed by a dinner to about fifty delegates and by the Founder's Day address and Convocation at the Royal Victoria College at 8.30. We trust that if His Excellency is able to come to Montreal for these ceremonies he would be present at the dinner and at Convocation.
