fourteen leagues in longitude ". By the other watch, which is that which had been opened at the island of Saint Pierre, the error would have been of '1 degree 45 minutes, that is, about twenty-feven leagues.

Now, the most experienced and skilful navigators make no scruple to own that in a run of two months, and sometimes less, they are apt to mistake by fifty or fixty leagues. How advantageous would it be then to the navy, to have a watch that, at the end of four months, would bring the longitude right, within fourteen leagues.

⁴⁹ In this determination, I fuppofe the longitude of Cadiz to be 8 deg. 21 min. but there is reafon to think this city lies 12 minutes farther west than it has been placed hitherto, which leffens the error of the time keepers by just fo many. They both agreed in placing Cadiz more westward than it stands in the maps.
