Only of these things be not ashained, And accept not persons unto sin:

2 Concerning the law of the Most High and the statute;

And of [justice], to administer punishment to the guilty;

- 3 Of reckoning with a comrade and traveler: And of divisions of an inheritance and property;
- 4a And of the fine dust of seales and balance,
- 5a And of testing(?) weights and measures.
- 4b Of goods between much and little :
- 5c Of estimating the wares of the merchant;
- 6 Against an evil woman a seal, And a place of weak hands a key!
- 7 In the place of deposit "tell" (thy money); And let all depositing and withdrawing be done with forms.
- 8 Of the correction of the simple and the fool;
 - Or of a grey-beard stumbling into harlots' [ne]t[s].
 - So shalt thou have been admonished indeed,

And a man well trained before all living.

- 9 A daughter is a treasure of concern to a father,
 - And an[x]iety for her dr[iveth away his slumber]:
 - In her maidenhood, lest she fade; In her wifesholod, lest she be hated.
- In her virginity, lest she be seduced;
 And in the house of her husband is barren.
 In the house of her father, lest she be [pregnant]:

And in the house of her husband [lest she bear not].

- - [Lest she make for thee] a name of evil odour,
 - A byword of the city, and a taunting of the people;
 - And put thee to shame [in the con]gregation of the gate.
