8. **The French Shore.**—Newfoundland once belonged to France. In the year 1713 France gave up N. F. Land and Nova Scotia to England. The French say the English agreed to allow the French fishermen to fish, and also to dry their fish on the western shore of the Island, which is called *The French Shore*. The French still claim the right to do so, and want to drive our fishermen away from that part of the shore, and there have been frequent quarrels between the French and the English fishermen.
