Guay, Chef l'Escadre, M. Macnamara being ill of the gout: their destination remaining a profound secret, they kept cruising in the Atlantic ocean, near the Streights of Gibraltar, till they entered the port of Cadiz,

In the mean time, the lords commissioners of the Admiralty received advice from captain Buckle of the Unicorn, dated May 9th, in Genoamole, that eleven days before, there had been orders published by beat of drum, for sailors to repair to Toulon: and that orders were likewise fent to Toulon, to fit out all the ships in that harbour.

May 30. CAPTAIN Scroope writes from Villafranca, that he had feen five ships of 60 and 70 guns in Hieres-bay. And the advices to Lord Holderness, of the 5th of June, specify an order for equipping the following ships of the line and frigates,
