This unexpected defeat, however excited the compassion of some of the factious in his support .--- A vote of thanks was moved for --- which, though but a flight recompence to the greedy maw of avarice, was not granted him till after an obstinate debate of some hours .-- What makes this debate the more fingular, is, that numbers of his new party saw so clear into the inconfistency of the business, that, through a conscientious delicacy, they were induced to remain neuter .-- However, a majority was carried, and a vote of thanks granted; but of that cool, frigid and icy indifference, that to a man of fentiment must necessarily have been the highest mortification.

Here it may not be improper to observe, that though a man may have been hurried away into irregularities and misdemeanours himself, he is not apt to admire the same line of conduct in others. This, I conceive, was the sole reason there were then so many silent and useless votes in the opposition; for who could find in his heart to vote for one who openly avowed, that self-interest alone was his darling passion; and reputation and integrity
