Such tales of a debauched electorate, a systematically debauched constituency, might be continued, atmost without end, merely with excerpts from the trial record. Why were not prosecutions started and the guilty brought to book? is a question which naturally arises. Because, by the provisions of the N.S. Election Act, no prosecution can be sustained, unless brought within a limited time. And this time had expired before the commencement of the trial.

But, before the bar of public opinion, the Conservative party of Nova Scotia, its rank and file and officers, has been adjudged
