He Was Enticed Across the Line From Canada by His Bondsmen.

Chicago, March 20.—Sydney A. Slocum has 10 days in which to walk to Canada. He started last night, and carries with him a certified order from Judge Grosscup giving him immunity from arrest for that length of time. Slocum was a refugee in Canada. He was wanted here, but his offence was not extraditable, so his bondsmen rescrited to strategy, got him across the line, arrested him, turned him over to the Federal authorities, and were discharged on their bond. Slocum applied for a writ of habeas corpus and Judge Grosscup heard the case yesterday. He held that the man had been unfairly dealt with, inasmuch as he had been extradited on another. He must be given a reasonable time, the judge said, in which to return to the country from which he was extradited.

Slocum said he had no money, and would probably have to walk back to Canada, so he asked for some order showing he had a reasonable time in which to walk the distance. The Court gave him ten days and also set aside the release of his bondsmen. Slocum's alleged offence was committed two years ago in Peoria, Ill.


