Outside conditions continue to lend their support to arguments for the rise, while they are becoming at the same time a more positive influence in the dealings. What another season of "bumper" crops means for the country's business in general was discussed in this column a week ago. The obvious effect of another period of great profits to the farmers would be to give another decided impetus to the trade movement and to further enlarge the earnings of the railroads. This is what the investment markets now have in prospect, as day by day goes by and no injury of any consequence is reported from the wheat belt. Harvest has been begun in the southwest and another fortingth will see the entire winter crop out of danger, with the promise of a yield very near to the record. Spring-sown wheat is fourishing over the eastern sections, and in the western portion the drought which caused some uneasiness early in the week has been relieved. The corn crop is mating excellent progress on an enormous area of cultivation, and the condition of cotton is well up to the average of previous years. Trade reports are favorable, and the years. 
