Toronto, Ont., Jan. 3.—11 p.m.—The
storm center which was in Northern
Ontario yesterday has passed to the
Gulf of St. Lawrence and has caused
fresh westerly gales in the Maritime
Provinces. Since last night a cold wave
from the northward of Lake Superior
has spread over Ontario and Quebec.
The weather continues mild in Mani-
toba and the Northwest Territories.

CRICKET.
SCORED FOUR CENTURIES.
MacLaren has scored the most cen-
turies of the English cricketers in Aus-
tralia, getting four of them, 132, 100,
181 and 109, and having a total of 633
for eight innings. Easton scored
708 in eight innings, his three centuries
being 185, 175 and 112 not out. Mason,
Hayward, Driscoll and Hirst all have
one century each. Briggs has been an
utter failure, and except in
matches against the Australians and the
visiting Englishmen, has never got
above one run, and of the scores of 50
and over Mason and Storer have three
each. MacLaren, Hayward and Driscoll
one each.

CRICKET IN AUSTRALIA.
Melbourne, Victoria, Jan. 4.—In the
second test match between the Aus-
tralians and the visiting English crick-
eters, the former were all out for 120
runs. At the close of play yesterday
afternoon the Englishmen had scored
22 runs for one wicket down.
