HOLD CAPTURED SHIPS IS PLAN,

No Agreement Yet Between Allied Powers As To Their Disposition.

CONGRESS TO DECIDE

If Excess Over Losses. Should Return Amount To Reparation Commission.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Feb. 20.— President Wilson informed the Senate today that he had not entered into any agreement or understanding with of-ficials of Great Britain concerning the related of ferent Britain concerning the sale of former German liners, seized in American ports, nor had he entered into any agreement or understanding with respect to what disposition should be made of them by the United States. At the same time, he transmitted to the Senate a copy of "proposed" agreement between the allied and associated governments at Paris under which governments at Paris, under which each is to retain as its own "the complete title to and use of all ships captured, seized or detained during the war as a war measure" and to "own the same free from any claim of the allied or associated governments."

This agreement further provides that in case the ships so detained by any allied or associated government are in excess of the claims of such governments for war losses in merchant ships, such government shall not make a claim for a share of other ships ceded under the treaty of peace. Not content with creating a magnificent interior in the playhouse proper, the idea of finely detailed beauty with a rich simplicity has been carried out in building the lobby. The color scheme here, as well as throughout the whole building, is old rose, ivory, French grey and gold, with touches of blue.

Marble Walls.

The base of the walls, as high as one's head, is covered with grey, highly-polished marble. The floors are paved with ground marble, while that of the vestibule is laid with corrugated red tile. Bordering the walls is a deep Grecian frieze. The lighting is accomplished by drop lights at frequent intervals, incased in alabaster globes, surmounted by upright lights. Two large ticket booths, built of plate glass and mahogany finished, will serve the patrons with tickets. The office which is to be regularly used is situated well within the first lobby, so that the ticket buyers will be protected from the weather. As one passes into the main lobby he is greeted by the bubbling water of a miniature fountain in a wicker setting.
