The Inordinate Profits on Sugar.

Sugar at twenty cents a pound is an outrage on the people of Canada. If there were any justification for such prices no one would object, but when the enhanced price is due very largely to the avaricious manufacturers and profiteers the people rightly raise a howl and demand that steps be taken by the government to stop the victous system of bleeding the public who have no recourse. The latest example of profits in sugar can be seen in the annual statement of the Atlantic Sugar Company, published on Monday last. For the year this company made over \$2,800.000, against \$986.343 in the previous year. The capital of the concern consists of outstanding bonds, \$1,420,000; preferred stock paid up, \$2.500,000, and common \$3.500,000. The leater was probably all water, as in the flotation in 1912 general subscribers were given 35 shares of common stock with each 100 of preferred purchased. The real money put in the enterprise

The Toronto World appears to be less than \$4,000,000, and last year profits of nearly \$3,000,000 were taken out. No wonder the common stock, which had little or no value in 1912, is now selling on the stock market at above \$150 a share. Is the government blind to this, or is it helpless to protect the people of Canada from this method of extortion? And this company is only one of many doing similar business in this and other food essentials.
