

POLAND TO DICKER

Deliveries of fruit were lighter at the wholesale fruit market at the foot of Scott street yesterday, and while prices were not materially affected, either one way or the other, the peaches seemed to sell a bit freer, with a good clean-up. Where all the fruit goes, in view of the adverse elements entering into the preserving business these days, is a mystery.

Peaches generally are quoted at from 30c to 40c on the 6's, 35c to 75c on the 11's lenos, 25c to 30c on the flats, and 40c to 50c on the 11's, with pears running around from 50c to 11. On the market yesterday the opinion among the commission men was that the peak of the peach season was about over.

Whelesale Early

ALBERTA SOLDIERS MAKE GOOD ON LAND

Calgary, Sept. 30.—Out of approximately 5,700 returned men who have been assisted by loans from the soldier settlement board in Alberta, more than 98 per cent. are making good on the land, and of the two per cent. remaining very few are failures thru any fault of their own, but rather owing to troubles over which they have no control.
