If the Solicitor General were prepared to table that correspondence we would be able to see at what level within the RCMP a recommendation was made that there be no acknowledgement of that letter. It would also allow us to pursue further questions on what degree of knowledge there was within the RCMP, and what participation there was in suppressing information about the illegal break-in. Solicitor General would present that exchange of correspondence tomorrow it would help resolve these unanswered questions.
