

pital investigation brought forth some interesting developments. One of the most surprising was the resignation of Miss Bowman, lady superintendent of the institution. At a special meeting of the governors this afternoon the resignation was received and promptly accepted.

It was dated to-day, and eaused the governors no surprise. In fact, it has been stated that the governors asked her to tender her resignation, but they will not admit it. The governors will visit the institution to-morrow, and will make arrangement.
